Early Bird Arrival - Sunday, October 3, 2010

ARRIVAL - Register at the **American Heritage Campground** Office. (All Campground fees must be paid directly to American Heritage Campground prior to your departure.) Setup your RV and receive your goodie bag. Rest, relax or explore the many amenities and various recreational activities at the campground. Meet and visit with other RV and Ameri-Camp Owners.

1:30 PM – Campground Club House, Chief Gene Adkins of the Eastern Chickahominy (pronounced chick-a-hom-a-nee) Indian Tribe will give a **presentation** hinged around his native tribe and customs with a display of handmade items and crafts. When Jamestown was founded, the tribe lived in established towns along the Chickahominy River. Because of their proximity to Jamestown, the Chickahominy people had early contact with the English settlers, helping them to survive during their first few winters here by trading food for other items. Later, the tribal members helped teach the settlers how to grow and preserve their own food. Captain John Smith made several trade voyages up the Chickahominy River to the heart of the Chickahominy land.
